Presbyterian Women in the Synod of the Rocky Mountains Report to PWS Coordinating Team January 14, 2019

The PW National Board of Directors/Churchwide Coordinating Team met Sept. 19-23, 2018 in Louisville, KY. This was my first meeting as your Synod Representative. I was assigned to the Justice and Peace Committee, USAME Committee, and By-laws Committee. The Justice and Peace and USAME committees both met during the meeting. I have since participated in several meetings with these committees via Zoom.

The Justice and Peace Committee established Substance Use Disorder as our focus issue for this triennium. We will also focus on Creation Care, with Yvonne Hileman, staff, to lead this advocacy. We are working on a Toolkit for Substance Use Disorder, with lots of information and resources, to be on the PW website. J & P is encouraging women to attend the Ecumenical Advocacy Days April 5-8, 2019 in Washington, DC. "Troubling the Waters for the Healing of the World" will provide tools to the participants to be Christian witnesses to justice, peace and the integrity of creation. The USAME Committee selected the synod delegates at the September meeting for the July 12-21, 2019 trip to New York. Jeri Joy, of the Presbytery of Wyoming, will be our delegate. I will also be attending as a USAME Committee member. I know we are both looking forward to this trip and will be anxious to share what we learn when we return. The local arrangements committee has established the itinerary and made suggestions for the reading list. Final details are in the works. Please keep this trip and the participants in your prayers.

The next PW Board/CCT meeting will be via Zoom Feb. 20 and 21. This will save dollars and time for PW and the board members. We will meet again in September at a face-to-face meeting.

I am truly blessed to be serving with such a great group of women who are dedicated to serving God, PW and the church. PW is looking for nominees for the next triennium for the PW National Board/CCT and if you are interested in being nominated, just let me know! I know there are many women in our presbytery who have the gifts to serve and who would be excellent nominees.





2019 PW Spring Gathering's Featured Speaker:



Dr. Mary Neal is a board-certified orthopedic spine surgeon who drowned while kayaking on a South American river. She experienced life after death. She went to heaven and back, conversed with Jesus and experienced God's encompassing love. She was returned to Earth with some specific instructions for work she still needed to do. Her life has been one filled with the miracles and intervention of God. Her story gives reason to live by faith and is a story of hope.

Dr. Neal was born and raised in Michigan and graduated from the University of Kentucky before attending the UCLA medical school. She completed her orthopedic surgery training at the University of Southern California after which she lived in Sweden, Switzerland, and Los Angeles while undergoing 1 1/2 years of specialty training in spinal surgery before becoming the director of spine surgery at USC. Five years later, she left the University for Private Practice.

She is the author of the New York Times bestseller: "7 Lessons from Heaven: How Dying Taught Me to Live a Joy-Filled Life" and "To Heaven and Back: A Doctor's Extraordinary Account of Her Death, Heaven, Angels, and Life Again: A True Story"

She currently lives and works in Jackson Hole, Wyoming, where she and her family enjoy everything the outdoor world offers, especially all forms of skiing, bicycling, boating, and hiking.

Dr. Neal will be speaking at our Gathering on Saturday, May 4th at 8:30am. Friends and family are invited to hear her free of charge.



The Sheridan Foster Parent Exchange was founded by Carla Trier and her 8 year old foster daughter in March of 2013. We help foster parents as they get new kiddos, we help foster parents who have adopted their foster children, we help parents who are reunifying with their child in foster care, we help adults who were foster children and are now parents, we help families who struggle after reunification, and we help grandparents who are guardians or parents to their grandchildren.
